Natural Gas Safety Reminders

Leaks-Recognize, React, Respond

Natural gas incidents are uncommon. Natural gas is lighter than air. Gas leaking outside usually vents into the atmosphere and dissipates rapidly. However, uncontrolled leaking natural gas can pose potential hazards when:

- 1. It mixes with air and at a specific fuel-to-air ratio, it is flammable.
- 2. It migrates into voids underground and openings, such as sewer lines.
- 3. It accumulates in an area and a spark or other source of ignition occurs.

Recognize the signs using your senses: A smell like rotten eggs or sulfur. This distinct odor is added to natural gas. A hissing sound near a natural gas pipeline, appliance or meter. Look for blowing dirt, bubbling sewer water, dry spots in most area, dead vegetation or exposed pipes.

React Immediately: Inside if the odor is faint inside your home or business, investigate immediately. If the source of the odor cannot be located or corrected, CALL MTNG IMMEDIATELY If a strong or persistent odor of gas is present in your home or business, or if you hear a hissing sound of escaping gas. OUTSIDE IF YOU SMELL OR DETECT NATURAL GAS OUTSIDE, CALL YOUR MTNG OFFICE IMMEDIATELY AT 1-833-438-6864.

Todd's Reminders

- -Do not leave hoses hooked up to outside hydrants this winter. They may freeze and bust. Please remember to open up your lower cabinet doors under the kitchen sink during extremely low temperatures to prevent frozen water pipes this winter.
- Inside furniture is not allowed on your porch. If you have any, you must remove it immediately to avoid being charged.
- Boats, trailers, go-carts, mini-bikes, 4-wheelers and/or any other off-road recreational vehicles are not allowed on MHA property without prior MHA approval. No vehicles over 2axles may park on the property for any length of time unless preapproved by MHA.
- -No working on vehicles, including oil or fluid changes, or displaying vehicles for sale will be permitted on the property or on the street running through the property. The only exception is the changing of a flat tire in order to make a vehicle operable. Tires are never allowed to be stored on the exterior of the property. Non-registered vehicles, inoperable vehicles, vehicles with expired tags, or any vehicles parked in "non-parking" areas may be towed at your expense.
